Briefing No. 3

Making Requests

1. Announce the Topic

This briefing is about making requests - asking guests to do things.

2. Why is this Important

We often need to ask a guest to do something, e.g. to say his room number, to fill out a form, etc.

If we do not use appropriate and courteous English, our request can sound like a command, and the guest may be upset. We do no have the right to tell a guest what to do - we must ask in a courteous manner.

Our Standard of Courtesy

Courteous Actions

- * Look the guest in the eyes when speaking
- * Use his name if you know it
- * Speak before asking
- e.g. "Could you <u>SIGN</u> the <u>BILL</u>, please?" before handing over the bill
- Wait for the guest to agree to your request before acting e.g. When you say "Could you <u>FOLLOW ME</u>, please?" Wait for the guest to show agreement before you move

Courteous English

- When making a request, say:
 "Could you , please, sir/madam"
 e.g. "Could you <u>REPEAT THAT</u>, please, sir/madam?"
 - "Could you SPELL YOUR NAME, please, sir/ madam?"

- Note: 1. There are other courteous ways of making a request, e.g. "May I know your name, sir/madam?"
 - 2. To keep it all simple: this exercise concentrates on "Could you, please" This is guaranteed 100% courteous.

Typical Mistakes and Discourtesies

Wrong Actions

- * Making requests silently:
- e.g. silently handing over the registration card or bill to a guest
- * Making request using only gestures:
- e.g. waving your hand instead of saying "Could you follow me, please"
- * Not looking at the guest when making a request

Wrong English

- * Making a request sounding like an order:
- e.g. Saying "Sign here"
- * Making a request without saying "please, sir/ madam"
- * Saying "please" twice in one sentence
- e.g. "Please fill in this form please"
- * Making a request by saying "I want you to"
- e.g. "I want you to sign here"
