

# Did you know?



#### Studies have shown that:

- More than 60% of what is believed about us is based upon visual messages
- Great first impressions happen in the first 20 seconds
- Bad first impression take 20 additional contacts to correct that bad first impression
- First impressions are lasting impressions





## The Professional Image

- Present a polished professional image
- Make use of the power of your appearance
- Your image speaks volumes about you
- \*Your professional image & appearance is reflected not only through your capabilities, but as well through your grooming habits, attitude and body language







### Uniform



- Must be worn properly and maintained clean and neat
- Must not be worn off duty
- Must be stainless (incl. gloves, aprons, neck scarf)
- Must be complete
- Must not be altered by staff member
- Plain socks and hosiery must be worn
- Skirt hems max. 5 cm above knee
- Blouses & shirts must be changed on a daily basis
- Jackets should be worn while on duty and buttoned

## Name Badge

- Name badge is part of your uniform
- Wear them on the left at chest-height (where your heart is ☺)
- \* Name should be visible and not faded









## Shoes & Footwear

- \* All footwear must be **clean**, polished, free of ornaments and **in good repair**
- Heels must be max. 5 cm (for safety & comfort reasons)
- No open toe footwear unless approved as part of the uniform
- Sandals and stilettos are prohibited










## Jewellery



- No jewellery which creates safety hazards for guests or staff members
- No visible piercing
- \* No ankle bracelets, thumb ring, toe rings
- No bracelets (Indian Kadas, religious wrist strings, bracelets should be hidden)
- One (1) ring and/or wedding band per hand on ring or middle finger is allowed
- Ring must be of plain design
- No earrings for men
- \* Ladies may wear small studs, one (1) per ear







#### Accessories



- No visible adornments (tooth gems, tattoos, body paint)
- **Sunglasses** are not to be worn **indoors**
- **Extreme** colored lenses or flamboyant spectaclesframes are to be avoided
- No proprietary or political insignias
- \* No propaganda/commercial cufflinks, pins, ties
- \* No tikkas on forehead (unless part of uniform)
- Headscarf has to match uniform or be of neutral design
- \* Belts must be plain leather with a classic or unadorned buckle
- ☆ Gloves, aprons and other accessories must be clean, spotless and free of holes and tears







## Did you know?

- # Half of men and a quarter of women do not wash their hands after using the toilet
- The number of germs on fingertips doubles after using the toilet
- A 1mm hair follicle can harbour up to 50,000 germs
- \$\mathbb{\pi}\$ 1,000 times as many germs spread from damp hands than from dry hands







## Personal Hygiene





- \* A daily shower with soap is required (before duty)
- Deodorant has effect only on a clean underarm skin
- Pay attention to dental hygiene and fresh breath
- Chewing gum is forbidden
- Nails should not inhibit performance of duties
- **Wash** hands **frequently**, after using the toilet and **always before serving** or eating food & beverages





### Scents and fresh breath

- Avoid using heavy/strong fragrances
- Light perfumes and after shave are permitted
- \* Fragrances must be applied on clean skin
- \* Avoid cigarettes on duty (smoke penetrates skin, uniform, hair)
- \* Avoid eating onion, garlic and very spicy food while or before duty (bad breathe and body odour)
- \* Brush teeth after meals on duty









# Body Language



#### Natural Smile.

Many facial muscle groups move involuntarily. The forehead muscles will "push down", cheeks and jaw move, and the nose may wrinkle.


The easiest way to spot a real smile is to look at the eyes. In natural smile the eyes become "squished" and may cause "crows feet". Only a small % of people can voluntarily move these eye muscles to "fake" a "real" smile:)



Forced or "polite" smile. Only muscles directly around the mouth are involved.

- Make eye-contact
- Read eye-signals & anticipate
- Open body posture
- Show interest, respect & response

- Smile
- Walk straight & stand upright
- Project poise & confidence







## Women – Hair







- Hair should be clean and shampooed regularly
- Hair should be neatly combed and groomed
- No extreme hairstyles or hair sculptures
- # Hair color, streaks & roots must be maintained
- Extreme hair color is not permitted
- \* Hair should be restrained from falling into face
- \* Hair ribbons must be color coordinated with the uniform
- \* Avoid extreme hair accessories









## Women – Skin





#### Complexion:

- Use skin care products and moisturiser
- Remove make-up daily before going to bed
- Drink enough water (2 litres per day)



#### Make-up:

- Light make-up application is required
- \* Make-up should be kept fresh looking throughout the day
- \* Lipsticks, mascara & eyeliners are to be in neutral shades
- Maintain eyebrows in shape















### Women – Hands and Feet







- \* Ladies nails must be manicured
- \* Nail colour must be neutral (no bright or metallic colours)
- \* No chipped nail polish
- No nail decorations (rhinestones, airbrush designs, decals,....)
- Food handlers may not wear nail enhancement (acrylic/gel)
- Moisturise hands with hand lotion to avoid dryness
- Nails and cuticles must be clean (no biting)
- Bare feet that are visible must have pedicures











## Men – Hair

- \* Must be shampooed daily
- Is trimmed regularly and neatly groomed (gel or wax to tame unruly hair)
- Short hairstyles only (may not touch shirt collar)
- \* No "extreme" hair styles (spikes, bleach)
- Natural looking colour















## Men – Skin



#### Complexion:

- Use skin care products and moisturiser
- Drink enough water (2 litres per day)

#### Shaving:

- \* Shave daily before duty
- Always use shaving foam
- \* A clean and sharp razor will avoid cuts and pimples
- Use aftershave to disinfect and for complete freshness









## Men – Facial Hair

- Beards and goatees are prohibited
- \* Sideburns must be mid ear
- ★ Where moustaches are permitted, they must be groomed neatly & trimmed; upper lip line must be visible











## Men – Hands and Feet

- \* Nails must be short and filed
- Moisturise hands with hand lotion to avoid dryness
- \* Nails and cuticles must be clean (no biting)
- \* Bare feet that are visible must have pedicures (short nails, free of calluses)
